POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

General Post Office, 15th June, 1882.

NOTICE.—1. On and from the 1st July next a Post Office Savings Bank will be open daily for the Receipt and Payment of Money at every Money Order Office in Tasmania, and during the hours appointed for the transaction of Money Order Business.

2. Deposits of One shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, will be received from any depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks; but no interest will be allowed on any sum in excess of One hundred and fifty pounds.

All deposits must be made in cash, or in notes issued by Tasmanian Banks, or in coupons on Tasmanian Government debentures.

3. Interest will be given on the money deposited in them at the rate of £3 10s. per cent. on sums not exceeding £150.

4. Depositors in these Banks have *Direct Government Security* for the prompt repayment of their deposits.

5. A Depositor in any one of the Post Office Banks can continue his deposits at any other of such Banks, or he can withdraw his money at the Post Office Bank most convenient to him.

6. The strictest secrecy is observed with regard to the names of the Depositors in the Post Office Savings Bank and the amount of their deposits.

7. Married Women may deposit money in the Post Office Savings Bank, and money so deposited will be repaid to the Depositor, unless her husband gives notice, in writing, of marriage, and claims payment of the deposits.

NOTE.—Nothing contained in the Savings Bank Regulations shall prejudice the rights of any woman who may have received a protection order under "The Matrimonial Causes Act, 24 Vict. Dispose of the drainage, refuse, waste products, dust, and all other foul matters of his establishment.

Keep his premises in good and efficient condition, and whitewash and thoroughly cleanse the same as often as may be necessary.

Adopt the best practicable means of rendering innocuous all vapour, steam, and emanations whatever emitted during the process of manufacture.

Store all raw and manufactured materials in such a manner and in such a situation as to prevent the emission of noxious effluvia therefrom.

And generally carry on his business in such manner as to best insure the health of the persons employed on the premises and the neighbourhood generally, and least likely to cause offensive smells and other nuisances.

Steam Whistles.

54. No person shall use, cause, or allow to be used, or assist in using, any steam whistle at any factory or other establishment so as to be a nuisance to any person; and no person who occupies or has the management or control of any factory or other establishment shall suffer or permit any steam whistle to be used thereat so as to be a nuisance to any person.

Keeping Swine.

55. No person shall keep any swine in a sty or otherwise within a radius of half a mile from the Formby Post Office, and also shall not erect any sty for the purpose of keeping of swine or keep any swine within One hundred feet of any dwelling within the boundaries of the Town of Formby, and outside of the radius of half a mile from the Post Office, as above directed.

Cow Sheds, &c.

56. No stable or cow-shed shall be erected within Thirty feet of any dwelling-house, school, or factory within the Town of Formby, unless such stable be divided from such dwelling-house, school, or factory by a wall as high at least as the highest part of such stable or cow-shed.

Urinals.

57. Every hotel or other public building shall provide a good and sufficient urinal, to be properly cleansed with water, to have a sufficient drainage, and a floor made of cement or other approved material.

Application of By-laws.

58. The foregoing By-laws [numbered 1 to 57] shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the place or places within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health.
